## REVIEW OF PSA SAFETY INFRINGEMENTS

- 1 As part of our ongoing commitment to enhance the safety of all port users, we are implementing measures to improve responsible driving within the container terminal facilities, and encouraging safer behaviour in wearing of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). These measures include increasing demerit points and revising enforcement charges for speeding and PPE-related offences. Such offences can potentially result in very serious consequences:

- 2 The table below reflects updates to the enhanced penalties for speeding offences:

S/n	Rules	Rule No.
1.	Exceeding speed limit by 1 to 10 km/hr in areas other than wharves	WT06
2.	Exceeding speed limit by 11 to 20 km/hr in areas other than wharves	LT06
3.	Exceeding speed limit by 21 to 30 km/hr in areas other than wharves	ST06
4.	Exceeding speed limit by 30 km/hr in areas other than wharves	VT06
5.	Exceeding speed limit in the wharves (Chassis lanes and backreach) by 1 to 10km/hr	ST05
6.	Exceeding speed limit in the wharves (Chassis lanes and backreach) by 10km/hr	VT07

- 3 The table below reflects updates to the enhanced penalties for failing to wear PPE:

S/n	Rules	Rule No.
1.	Failing to wear appropriate head protection	V111
2.	Failing to wear appropriate foot protection	S112
3.	Failing to wear appropriate high visibility vest	V116
4.	Failing to wear appropriate hand protection	S118
5.	Failing to wear appropriate hearing protection	V119
6.	Failing to wear appropriate uniform	S120
7.	Failing to wear appropriate personal protective apparel	S159

W - Warning (No demerit points and no enforcement charges)

L - Less Serious (2 demerit points and \$75.00 fine)

S - Serious (4 demerit points and \$150.00 fine)

V - Very Serious (8 demerit points and \$300.00 fine)

## REVIEW OF PSA SERIOUS SAFETY INFRINGEMENTS

- 1 As part of our ongoing commitment to enhance the safety of all port users, we are implementing measures to improve responsible driving within the container terminal facilities. These measures include increasing demerit points and revising enforcement charges for road traffic offences. Such offences can potentially result in very serious consequences.
- 2 The table below reflects changes to the demerit points and enforcement charges:

S/n	Rules	Demerit points	Enforcement charges
1.	Using mobile communication devices while driving	12 (increase from 8 points)	\$300 (no change)  Additional penalties: 1 <sup>st</sup> offence – 1 week suspension 2 <sup>nd</sup> offence – 1 month suspension - Undergo safety assessment at Pass Office before reinstating access - Reset after 24 months from latest offence
2.	Driver failing to wear a seatbelt or failing to ensure every passenger wears a seatbelt	8 (increase from 4 points)	\$150 (no change)
3.	Failing to conform to traffic light signals	12 (increase from 4 points)	\$300 (increase from \$150)
