REVIEW OF PSA SAFETY ENFORCEMENT

- 1 PSA has recently conducted a review on the Safety Enforcement to achieve the following:
 - a. Encourage and shape safer behaviour
 - b. Improve safety performance
- 2 Currently, personnel who accumulates 24 or more demerit points within 24 months, will be denied entry into the port for a stipulated period and attend the relevant safety remedial training before returning to work.
- 3 With effect from 1 Apr 2023, all **new pass applicants** who accumulate 12 or more demerit points within 12 months of pass issuance will be denied entry for 1 month, and attend the relevant safety remedial training. (Applicable to those who apply PSA pass from 1 Apr 2023)
- 4 Personnel whose PSA pass has been cancelled or expired for more than 1 year will be treated as first time pass applicants when they reactivate their pass.

*Appendix:

- If a first time pass applicant is issued with PSA pass on 1 Apr 23, his 'new applicant' status will last until 31 Mar 24.
- If he accumulates 12 or more demerit points on 3 Aug 23, he will be denied entry for 1 month (4 Aug to 3 Sep 23) and has to attend re-training before he is allowed entry. He can attend re-training during this 1-month period.
- From his return on 4 Sep 23 to 31 Mar 24, if he accumulates 24 demerit points or more (inclusive of demerit points accumulated earlier), he will be denied entry for 3 months. He can only attend re-training after the 3-month period.
